### Allocation of Qualification Slots

The qualification slot is allocated to the NPC not to the individual athlete. In case of a Bipartite Commission Invitation the slot is allocated to the individual athlete not to the NPC.

### Maximum Quota Allocation per NPC

An NPC can be allocated a maximum of seven (7) male qualification slots and a maximum of six (6) female qualification slots for a total of thirteen (13) qualification slots with a maximum of one (1) slot allowed per medal event.

Exceptions may be granted through the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation method.

### Athlete Eligibility

To be eligible for competition athletes must:

- have competed in at least one (1) international, sanctioned IBSA Judo competition between 1 January 2014 and 31 December 2015; and



- be internationally classified with a 'Confirmed' sport class status or a 'Review' sport class status with a review date after 31 December 2016.

### Maximum Entry per NPC

An NPC can enter a maximum of one (1) eligible athlete per individual event. NPCs may only enter athletes in medal events in which they have achieved a qualification slot.

### QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

Qualification slots will be allocated as follows:

METHOD	QUALIFICATION	TOTAL
<b>2014 World Championships Allocation</b>	The top ranked athlete in each medal event obtains one (1) qualification slot for their respective NPC.	7 male athletes 6 female athletes
<b>2015 World Ranking List Allocation</b>	The top nine (9) ranked male athletes (not otherwise qualified) in each medal event on the IBSA Judo 2015 Men's World Ranking List closing 31 December 2015 obtain a qualification slot for their respective NPC.  The top five (5) ranked female athletes (not otherwise qualified) in each medal event on the IBSA Judo 2015 Women's World Ranking List closing 31 December 2015 obtain a qualification slot for their respective NPC.	63 male athletes 30 female athletes
<b>Host Country Allocation</b>	The host country directly qualifies one (1) athlete in each medal event for which the host country has entered at least one (1) athlete in the 2014 IBSA Judo World Championships.  Any unused host country slots will be allocated via the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation method.	7 male athletes 6 female athletes
<b>Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation</b>	One (1) eligible male athlete per medal event will be considered by the IPC and IBSA Judo for a Bipartite qualification slot.  One (1) eligible female athlete per medal event will be considered by the IPC and IBSA Judo for a Bipartite qualification slot.	7 male athletes 6 female athletes



	To be considered for a Bipartite slot, NPCs must submit an official application in writing to IBSA Judo by 8 February 2016.

## TIMELINE

1-7 September 2014	2014 IBSA Judo World Championships, Colorado Springs, USA
31 December 2015	End of the period for performances to be recorded on the IBSA Judo 2015 World Ranking List
18 January 2016	IBSA Judo confirms in writing to the NPCs the allocation of qualification slots.
25 January 2016	Start of Bipartite Commission Invitation application process.
1 February 2016	NPCs confirm in writing to IBSA the use of allocated qualification slots.
8 February 2016	IBSA Judo confirms in writing to the NPCs the reallocation of unused qualification slots
8 February 2016	Deadline to submit Bipartite Commission Invitation applications to IBSA Judo
22 February 2016	IBSA Judo confirms in writing the awarding of Bipartite Commission Invitation slots
27 May 2016	Deadline for Rio 2016 Organising Committee to receive accreditation application forms submitted by NPCs (“Accreditation Long List”)
15 August 2016	Deadline for Rio 2016 Organising Committee to receive sport entry forms submitted by NPCs



## **CONFIRMATION PROCESS OF ALLOCATED SLOTS**

By 1 February 2016 each qualified NPC must confirm to IBSA in writing (only email is accepted) if they wish to use their allocated slot. NPCs that have not responded by this date will lose their team qualification slots, and IBSA may reallocate these slots.

By 8 February 2016 IBSA will confirm in writing the reallocation of all unused qualification slots.

By 22 February 2016 it is officially declared that the respective NPCs will use the allocated slots for the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games. Any NPC that does not use its allocated slots may be subject to sanctions by IPC and IBSA.

## **REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION SLOTS**

Any qualification slots allocated and not used by the respective NPC will be reallocated regardless of region to the highest ranked athlete in the same medal event (not otherwise qualified) on the IBSA Judo World Ranking List closing 31 December 2015.
