Allocation of Qualification Slots

The qualification slot is allocated to the individual athlete, not to the NPC.

Maximum Quota Allocation per NPC

An NPC can be allocated a maximum of seven (7) male qualification slots and a maximum of six (6) female qualification slots for a total of thirteen (13) qualification slots with a maximum of one (1) slot allowed per medal event.

Exceptions may be granted through the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation method.

Athlete Eligibility

To be eligible for competition athletes must:

- be born before 1 January 2006;
- have competed in at least one (1) international, sanctioned IBSA Judo competition which provides World Ranking Points between 1 January 2018 and 31 May 2020; and



- be internationally classified with a 'Confirmed' sport class status or a 'Review' sport class status with a review date after 31 December 2020.

Maximum Entry per NPC

An NPC can enter a maximum of one (1) eligible athlete per individual event with exceptions granted to Bipartite invitees. NPCs may only enter an athlete in the medal event in which the athlete has obtained a qualification slot.

QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

Qualification slots will be allocated as follows:

TIMELINE

1 Sep. 2018	Start of the period for performances to be recorded on the IBSA Judo World Ranking List
16-18 Nov. 2018	IBSA Judo World Championships, Odivelas, Portugal
8 May 2020	Deadline for Tokyo 2020 Organising Committee to receive accreditation application forms submitted by NPCs (“Accreditation Long List”)
31 May 2020	End of the period for performances to be recorded on the IBSA Judo 2020 World Ranking List
18 June 2020	IBSA Judo confirms in writing to the NPCs the allocation of qualification and host country slots
18 June 2020	Start of Bipartite Commission Invitation application process
1 July 2020	NPCs confirm in writing to IBSA the use of allocated qualification and host country slots
1 July 2020	Deadline to submit Bipartite Commission Invitation applications to IBSA Judo
8 July 2020	IBSA Judo confirms in writing to the NPCs the reallocation of unused qualification slots
8 July 2020	IBSA Judo confirms in writing the awarding of Bipartite Commission Invitation slots
3 August 2020	Deadline for Tokyo 2020 Organising Committee to receive sport entry forms submitted by NPCs

CONFIRMATION PROCESS OF ALLOCATED SLOTS

By 1 July 2020 each qualified NPC must confirm to IBSA in writing (only email is accepted) if they wish to use their allocated slots. NPCs that have not responded by this date will lose their team qualification slots, and IBSA may reallocate these slots.

By 8 July 2020 IBSA will confirm in writing the reallocation of all unused qualification slots.

By 8 July 2020 it is officially declared that the respective NPCs will use the allocated slots for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games. Any NPC that does not use its allocated slots may be subject to sanctions by IPC and IBSA.



REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION SLOTS

Any qualification slots allocated and not used by the respective NPC will be reallocated to the highest ranked athlete in the same medal event (whose NPC is not otherwise qualified) on the IBSA Judo World Ranking List closing 31 May 2020.

Any ring-fenced B1 qualification slot allocated and not used by the respective NPC will be reallocated to the highest ranked B1 athlete in the same medal event up to the 20th rank (whose NPC is not otherwise qualified) on the IBSA Judo World Ranking List closing 31 May 2020. If no suitable B1 athlete (up to the 20th rank) is available, the slot will be reallocated to the highest ranked athlete in the same medal event (whose NPC is not otherwise qualified) on the IBSA Judo World Ranking List closing 31 May 2020.
