1 ACCREDITATION AND VENUE ACCESS

1.1 The Paralympic Identity and Accreditation Card

A validated Paralympic Identity and Accreditation card (PIAC) is required by athletes and NPC team officials to access the Paralympic Villages and venues. Athletes and NPC team officials may also use the Sochi 2014 and public transportation systems upon presentation of their PIAC.

1.2 Access Codes and Symbols

The accreditation zones are secure and orderly areas reserved only for accredited persons who have access to the corresponding zones in which they perform their Games-time functions.

Accreditation zones inside the competition venues are:

Access code	Accessible areas
BLUE	Competition areas (field of play), administrative and operational areas
RED	Administrative and operational areas
2	Athlete preparation areas
4	Press areas
5	Broadcast areas
6	Paralympic Family areas

There is also a White Zone area at the competition venues where accredited persons may circulate. The above-mentioned access rights grant access to the White Zone areas.

Zones and symbols inside the Village are:

R Residential Zone of the Paralympic Village

The Paralympic Village code automatically grants access to the Paralympic Village Plaza (formerly known as International Zone). Zone R also grants access to the Paralympic Village Plaza, in addition to the Residential Zone.

Nordic Ski Housing does not have separate zones inside the secure perimeter.

1.4 Replacement of Lost, Damaged or Stolen PIAC

If a PIAC is lost or damaged (for example, torn or water-damaged) after validation, a PIAC can be reissued.

- The individual concerned must make a written, signed declaration countersigned by an authorized representative from the NPC.
- A lost or damaged PIAC will be cancelled in the accreditation system, and a lost PIAC will not be reactivated even if found at a later date.
- A lost PIAC will be reissued no sooner than 24 hours after notification has been submitted. Reissuance will take place only at designated accreditation facilities. A day pass will be issued at competition venues while the new PIAC is processed.

1.5 Athletes and NPC Team Officials Access to Competition Venues

Athletes and NPC team officials can access their discipline's venues with validated accreditation.

Athletes and NPC team officials: competition venues for their own discipline

All athletes and NPC team officials have access with their accreditation to their own discipline's venue to watch the competitions from the athlete stand. Same-discipline athletes and NPC team officials can access the seating in the athlete stand on a first-come first-served basis. If the athlete stand at the outdoor venues is full, the athletes and NPC team officials will still be able to watch the events from the standing general spectators' area.

Athletes and NPC team officials: competition venues for other disciplines

At all outdoor venues, different-discipline athletes and NPC team officials can access the spectators' standing areas with their accreditation only. No additional ticket will be required.

At all indoor venues, different-discipline athletes and NPC team officials will be able to access athlete stands using only their accreditation (no additional ticket required).

There may be an exception for Ice Sledge Hockey bronze and gold medal events for which accreditation and a complimentary ticket would then be required. Sochi 2014 will confirm during the Games time if complimentary tickets will be required for these two events.

2 PARALYMPIC VILLAGES

There will be two Paralympic Villages - the Coastal Paralympic Village (CVL) and the Mountain Paralympic Village (MVL). There will also be Nordic Ski Housing (NSH) at Psekhako Ridge, which will have reduced services compared to the Villages. The table below shows the sport disciplines served by each Paralympic Village.

2.1 Access to the Villages and Village Entrances

Each Paralympic Village and Nordic Ski Housing has a Village Plaza and a Residential Zone. The two zones are separated by internal fencing and access control. Entrance to either zone requires an appropriate accreditation or compliance with established policies.

To ensure the safety of resident athletes and NPC team officials, entrance to the Villages through any exterior access control points requires appropriate accreditation and a security check of both people and personal items.

Each of the Paralympic Villages and NSH shares a common security

perimeter with nearby competition venues or cluster of venues.

The Mountain Paralympic Village (MVL) has a common security perimeter with an intermediary zone, which includes two gondola stations. This zone, in turn, has a common security perimeter with the Rosa Khutor Extreme Park (the venue for Para-Snowboard).

The Nordic Ski Housing has a common security perimeter with the Biathlon and Cross-Country Skiing venues.

The Coastal Paralympic Village shares a security perimeter with the Olympic Park. To expedite the passage of Village residents through the access control points between a Village/NSH and the venues within a shared security perimeter, only an accreditation check will be required.

The primary entrance for athletes and NPC team officials is through the NPC dedicated vehicle parking area and Village transportation mall. However, athletes and NPC team officials may enter the Village through any entrance. In MVL, there is also a pedestrian and shuttle-supported access point 100 meters from the midway gondola station (VI), entering directly into the Mountain Paralympic Village Plaza and an internal shuttle from midway gondola station near the Guest Pass Center by the East Transport Mall.

2.2 Residential Zone

2.2.1 Resident Centers

Resident Centers are located throughout each Paralympic Village Residential Zone and are operated by resident hosts. Each Resident Center serves approximately 500 residents and operates from 07:00 to 23:00. In each Village, one location operates 24 hours daily. Each NPC has been given the telephone number to its assigned Resident Center. Calls will be answered by resident hosts in the order they are received. After 23:00, calls will be automatically routed to the 24-hour Resident Center. Each Resident Center has the following:

- Info+ terminal and printer
- Computer with Internet access
- Wireless Internet access
- Television
- Laundry facilities nearby and monitored by Resident Center staff
- Lounge area

NPCs should contact their Resident Center for Village information, lockout assistance, towel exchange, laundry assistance and for responses to various requests.

Each Village operates one 24-hour Resident Center that will provide the same level of service as the other Resident Centers with the addition of the following:

- 24 hours service by resident hosts
- Management and storage of all Village lost and found items
- Payments for key replacement and non-standard housekeeping and cleaning services in Russian Rubles or Visa credit cards. Cashiers operate 10:00-19:00 daily
- Off-Airport Processing Desk during bulk departures
- The 24-hour Resident Centers will be located in the heart of the Residential Zone of each Paralympic Village and the main hotel building of the Nordic Ski Housing.

2.2.2 Laundry Services

- Self-serve washers and dryers are available free of charge inside the Resident Centers. Laundry soap, irons and ironing boards are available free of charge at the self-service laundries. Two net laundry bags will be placed in each room prior to arrival.
- Dry cleaning drop-off will be available for a few at the Village Plaza in both villages and NSH. Staff is available at all locations between 07:00-23:00, and 24 hours in the 24 hour Resident Centers.

2.2.3 Housekeeping Services

Daily:

- Waste/recycling bins emptied
- Beds made in each room
- Bathrooms cleaned
- Toilet paper and other resident amenities replenished
- Floors cleaned
- Dusting

Every two days:

• Towels replaced (towels may also be exchanged at a Resident Center)

Every four days:

• Sheets changed

2.3 Food Services

All accredited athletes and team officials, including As with prepurchased dining privileges will have unlimited access to the Villages dining halls.

The dining halls are open 24 hours a day from March 1, 2010 to March 19, 2014.

Each Main Dining Hall has the following food stations:

- Grill station serving grilled meat including fish, beef, pork and chicken with fresh vegetables
- Russian and regional section
- Pizza and pasta, with fresh-baked pizza, pasta
- Deli and salad bar offering assorted sliced meats, cheeses, fresh bread, salads, gourmet condiments
- Gourmet coffee and bakery serving hot beverages and sweet treats (pastries, cookies, muffins)

- Dairy products
- Dry cereal
- Hot and cold beverages, fresh fruit and breads
- McDonalds will be available in the Coastal Paralympic Village only.

To maintain the health, safety and cleanliness of the Paralympic Villages/NSH, residents and guests may not remove food from the dining hall. Exceptions are made for one beverage, and/or one piece of whole fruit, one ice cream or a McDonald's Restaurant product that is in the process of being eaten.

2.4 Residential Zone Facilities

The Paralympic Villages offers entertainment programming designed for the athletes and available to all residents. Residents may listen to live and recorded music, and enjoy performances, dancing and other activities. The Village club in each Village will provide an intimate gathering place where athletes and officials can relax, watch television and socialize. Performances will be organized on a daily basis.

In NSH, the entertainment programming will be limited and not available on a daily basis.

2.4.1 Fitness Centers

The Fitness Center in each Paralympic Village will offer residents a place to exercise and train. Modern fitness and weight training equipment will be available, as well as space for stretching.

The Fitness Center is open 24 hours daily. Fitness trainers will be present from 06:00 – 23:00.

2.4.2 DVD Lounges

Residents can choose from a library of DVDs for viewing in lounges located in the Residential Zones of both Villages and NSH.

The DVD lounges operate from 10:00 to 24:00.

2.4.3 Internet Access Points

Free-of-charge wireless internet access will be available in the following areas of the Paralympic Villages and NSH:

- DRM building in the Coastal Paralympic Village
- In both Paralympic Villages and NSH:
- Residential spaces and private bedrooms
- NPC Services Centers
- Resident Centers
- NPC Offices
- Internet and Call Centers
- Village Clubs
- Fitness Centers
- Village Plazas

To access the network for the first time from any Wi-Fi enabled device (smartphone, tablet or laptop) please complete the following steps:

- 1. Select 'Sochi2014-Free' network (Sochi2014-Free)
- 2. Enter the network password: hotcoolyours
- 3. The device will be authenticated for this network for the duration of the Games.
- 4. The password will not need to be re-entered to enable this network on the device.

2.4.4 Games Centers

Located in the heart of the Residential Zones of both Villages and NSH, these Games Centers will feature video games, table games and other popular games.

Games Center hours: 10:00 - 24:00

2.4.5 Multi-Faith Centers

Sochi 2014 will provide a place for worship and meditation in each CVL and MVL only. Each Village's Multi-Faith Center has multiple rooms that may be used for formal religious services and ceremonies as well as for individual meditation and counselling. The Multi-Faith Center is open 24 hours daily and staffed by volunteers from 08:00 to 22:00.

There will be no Multi-Faith Center in NSH.

2.5 Village Polyclinics

The Polyclinics in both Paralympic Villages will be operating with full services between 07:00 and 23:00 from March 1, 2014 to March 19, 2014, inclusive. First aid and emergency services are available overnight from 23:00 – 07:00.

Nordic Ski Housing will provide a limited number of medical services from March 1-19, 2014 inclusive from 12:00 – 21:00. All athletes and Paralympic Family members staying in NSH will have access to the Polyclinics of both Paralympic Villages. Visits can be booked at the Nordic Ski Housing Clinic reception desk.

2.6 Village Plaza

The Village Plaza is the common gathering area in each Paralympic Village, with recreation and leisure, retail and other facilities for residents and guests.

2.6.1 Village Café

The Village Café provides a comfortable and cozy atmosphere where residents can socialize with their guests and enjoy coffee and snacks. Beverages will be free of charge for Village resident; for non-residents, payment must be made in cash (Russian Rubles) or by Visa card. In NSH, the Village Café will be a comfortable lounge area but no food or beverage services will be available.

2.6.2 Internet Center

An Internet Center will be available in the Village Plaza in each of the two Villages and NSH. Each Internet Center will provide computers, a printer, internet access including Wi-Fi, and user assistance for athletes and officials. One shared-access computer with internet will also be located in each Resident Center.

2.6.3 Retail Services

The following retail services are provided in each Village/NSH Plaza:

- Bank (MVL and CVL only)
- Visa Automated Teller Machine
- Post Office
- Village Store
- Sochi 2014 Official Merchandise store
- City and Village Information Desk
- Beauty Salon Services
- Courier Services
- Internet and Call Center

Payment is accepted in cash in Russian Rubles or by Visa cards. All retail services operate daily from 09:00 to 21:00. Hours will be reduced during the Villages pre-opening and closing periods.

2.7 Other Village Services

Other Village services include floral arrangements, dry cleaning, tailoring services are available in both CVL, MVL and NSH for a fee. In CVL and MVL, photo services are also available for a fee.

2.7.1 Internal Shuttles

Coastal Paralympic Village

The internal Village shuttle will operate on a regular basis from March 1 to 19 inside the Residential Zone. It will connect the Village Plaza, the dining hall, residences and the Welcome Center.

Mountain Paralympic Village

Two shuttle routes will serve the Mountain Paralympic Village. One route will operate in the Residential Zone, connecting Rosa Khutor Gondola VI station, Village plaza, residences, dining hall, the East Transport Mall and the NPC dedicated partking lots. A second shuttle will connect the 3S Gondola (VII) miway station and East Transport Mall. Both shuttles operate 24 hours per day with reduced frequency between 01:00 and 05:00.

Nordic Ski Housing

The internal shuttle route at NSH will connect the apartment building and hotel complex 24 hours per day with reduced frequency between 01:00 and 05:00 daily.

2.7.2 Non-Smoking Policy

In accordance with IPC policy, the Paralympic Villages/NSH are non-smoking venues. It is forbidden to smoke in any building in the Paralympic Village. Limited outdoor smoking areas, located at least three metres from building doorways, are clearly marked. No tobacco products are sold or distributed within the Villages/NSH.

2.7.3 Alcohol Policy

Neither Sochi 2014, nor its suppliers sell or serve alcoholic beverages inside the Paralympic Villages/NSH.

2.7.4 Coca-Cola Complimentary Beverages

Coca-Cola devices will provide access to free Coca-Cola beverages from distribution machines throughout each Paralympic Village/ NSH and at other Sochi 2014 venues. Each NPC will receive a quantity of Coca-Cola devices equal to the number of all accredited athletes and NPC team officials.

2.7.5 Law Enforcement

Police officers are available in the Paralympic Villages to assist residents and guests with any concerns and questions while also providing direct, dedicated service.

2.7.6 Ambulance and Fire Services

Ambulances and fire service vehicles have direct, expedited access to all areas of the Village when required.

3 TRANSPORTATION

3.1 Village to Village and Venue TA Service

The dedicated Athletes and NPC team officials' Transportation System (TA) provides scheduled service between both Paralympic Villages and Nordic Ski Housing beginning on March 1 and ending March 19, 2014.

Transportation to the official competition venues starts on the first day of training or competition at the venue.

3.2 Coastal Cluster TA Transportation

Competition Venues

The Coastal Cluster TA transport system is divided into two separate systems that connect the Coastal Paralympic Village with venues in the Olympic Park.

1 Accessible vehicles will be provided for the team sports (Ice Sledge Hockey and Wheelchair Curling) from in front of the team's accommodation located inside the Coastal Paralympic Village directly to the venue. 2 TA1 route: The Olympic Park scheduled accessible shuttle will be available for both competing and spectating athletes travelling from the Coastal Paralympic Village to the Ice Cube Curling Center and the Shayba Arena. The accessible shuttle will operate with a regular frequency based on the competition schedule.

The service schedule will be aligned with the competition and training schedule. Shuttles will not stop at a venue if there is no competition or training scheduled for the day.

3.3 Mountain Cluster TA Transportation

The Mountain Cluster TA system will provide direct scheduled bus service for athletes and team officials travelling from the Mountain Paralympic Village to Rosa Khutor Alpine Center.

Athletes and team officials travelling from MVL to the Nordic Ski Housing (NSH) and Laura Biathlon Stadium at Laura Cross-Country Ski stadium (CBV) will use the Village-to-Village connection service. They will travel by bus from MVL to the Laura Base Station where they will transfer to a dedicated gondola. At the Laura Top Station athletes will take a shuttle to the NSH or CBV.

3.4 Nordic Ski Housing

The TA system at NSH is accessed by scheduled service that connects the Nordic Ski Housing (NSH) with the Cross-Country Stadium.

- 1 Accessible minibus shuttles depart from NSH residential zone and serve the following venue:
 - Cross-Country Stadium Route TA19
- 2 Accessible minibus shuttles depart from Laura Top Station and go to the Hotel Complex Route TA21.

3.4.1 Transportation for Spectating Athletes and NPC Team Officials

Ice sledge hockey and wheelchair curling teams are able to use their dedicated team buses to travel to the events held at the Ice Cube Curling Center or Shayba Arena Spectating athletes and NPC team officials can share the scheduled transportation services with competing/training athletes and NPC team officials, except for Wheelchair Curling and Ice Sledge Hockey team buses.

Sochi 2014 Transportation will prioritize passenger access as follows:

- 1 Competing athletes
- 2 Team officials accompanying competing athletes
- 3 Training athletes
- 4 Team officials accompanying training athletes
- 5 Spectating athletes (where applicable)

For sport venues outside of their respective cluster, spectating athletes may use the Village - to – Village connection service.

4 TRAINING AT THE PARALYMPIC COMPETITION VENUES

Athletes can train at the Paralympic competition venues. Ice Sledge Hockey also has a dedicated training venue. Training schedules were prepared in advance by Sochi 2014 the International Paralympic Sport Federations (IPSFs).

Games-time training can be further divided into general and official training as described below.

4.1 General Training

- General training (also referred to in some disciplines as "free training") sessions take place on the competition and/or training field of play;
- The format and program of the training session during general training is at the discretion of the athletes and/or their NPC team officials;
- The general training sessions are scheduled by competition management well in advance of the Paralympic Games; however, the schedule is flexible and may be changed at Games time.
- For ice sledge hockey, the schedule is flexible and teams may request schedule changes up to 17:00 the day prior to planned training.

- For individual disciplines, participation in a training session is optional and at the discretion of the athletes and/or their NPC team officials.
- Alpine skiing is the only discipline for which athletes must sign up for training. Team leaders can sign up for training at the Sport Information desk or at the Team Captains' meetings.

4.2 Official Training

- Official training sessions replicate competition conditions with specific dates, timing and format. The official training sessions are scheduled by the IPSFs prior to the Games and are included in the training schedule published by Sochi 2014 Sport department.
- Training session format is defined by the IPSFs, and training times are determined by the IPSFs in cooperation with Sochi 2014 for each athlete/team (i.e., the schedule is pre-determined and not flexible).
- The timing, scoring and results systems are operational and the Games Officials are usually present to observe or oversee training.
- There is no official training for Ice Sledge Hockey.

5 CEREMONIES

5.1 Team Welcome Ceremonies

The Team Welcome Ceremonies will take place in the Village Plaza of the Mountain Paralympic Village from March 4 to 6, 20114, between 10:00 and 17:00. Each ceremony will last approximately 30 minutes.

5.2 Opening Ceremony

The Sochi 2014 Paralympic Winter Games Opening Ceremony will be held at Fisht Olympic Stadium on March 7, 2014 from 20:14 to approximately 22:00. The Parade of Athletes will start at 20:25.

Athletes and NPC team officials will be transported by bus from each Paralympic Village directly to a load zone near to the staging area in Bolshoy Ice Dome. Athletes and officials from NSH will take buses to the gondola station and re-board buses at the Laura Bottom Station to take them to the load zone near to the staging area in the Bolshoy Ice Dome. Travel from the Mountain Paralympic Village to the Bolshoy Ice Dome staging area is 1.5 hours. Travel from the Coastal Paralympic Village will take 10 minutes by bus or 20 minutes on foot. Travel from NSH will take approximately 2 hours. The ceremony will be approximately two hours long. After the ceremony, the buses will return directly to the Paralympic Villages and NSH.

5.3 Closing Ceremony

The Closing Ceremony will be held at Fisht Olympic Stadium on March 16, 2014 beginning at 20:14 and ending at approximately 22:00. Transportation to the Closing ceremonies will be very similar to that of the Opening Ceremonies.

5.4 Flower Ceremonies

Flower ceremonies will take place in the competition venues immediately following the completion of medal events. The ceremonies will feature the presentation of a floral bouquet to each medalist, but will not include the presentation of medals, raising of flags or playing of the gold medalist's national anthem.

5.5 In-Venue Victory Ceremonies

On March 15 and 16, Victory Ceremonies for alpine skiing, wheelchair curling, ice sledge hockey, and cross-country skiing events will occur in-venue immediately following the medal session.

5.6 Nightly Victory Ceremonies at Paralympic Medals Plaza

Victory Ceremonies at the Paralympics Medals Plaza will take place on the same day as the competition or the day after. During the medal presentation portion of the nightly Victory Ceremonies, the medalists will receive a floral bouquet and a medal. The flags of the medalists will be raised, and the gold medalist's national anthem will be played in his/her honour. All accredited athletes and NPC team officials have free access to the Victory Ceremonies with their accreditation. Info+ is the Games information system that will provide competition schedules, near real-time results and reports, medal rankings, records, biographies, news, historical results, weather forecasts, bulletin board services and transport information.

The Info+ terminal is a desktop PC, keyboard, mouse and monitor configured for Info+ access only. Info+ terminals will be available in common areas of all competition and non-competition venues, including Paralympic Villages.

Useful Tips

 If the caller doesn't speak Russian, the Emergency Dispatcher will connect the caller to a special unit of the Emergency Services with English, French and German speakers. There is no direct number for the services in a foreign language.

- If you use foreign language support, be patient as translation would require some time
- For non-Russian speakers, knowing key words in Russian like politsiya (police), pozharnaya (fire brigade), skoraya pomoshch (ambulance) and notifying the call taker of the language they speak (English, French or German) will help speed up the process
- Advise the call taker if you require fire, police, or ambulance
- Know your location
- Be prepared to answer questions

In accordance with the Russian Federation legislation, emergency medical services are provided free of charge.

9 SUSTAINABILITY

From the very beginning sustainable development principles were embodied into the preparations for the Games in Sochi. The Games organizers made the most of opportunities of the Paralympic project to create positive changes in economic, social and ecological spheres.

Sochi 2014 Sustainability Agenda defines six main areas of activities (Healthy Living, Harmony with Nature, Barrier-free World, Economic Prosperity, Modern Technologies, Culture and National Values). Practically all activities within the Paralympic project are dedicated to their implementation creating long-lasting positive legacy for Sochi, Krasnodar region and Russia.

Athletes and Officials can contribute to these goals by considering the following strategies:

- Use available transportation shuttles and public transportation to visit venues and to travel through the Host Region, instead of renting private vehicles. If possible, cycle or walk instead of using vehicles.
- Turn off the light, computer and air conditioning when leaving office or home.
- Save paper. Use e-mail instead of printing. Set printers to print on both sides of a page.
- Save water. Turn off water while brushing teeth.
- Segregate waste before disposal.
- Buy smart. Take reusable bags to stores.

The largest Russian resort and longest city in Europe, Sochi is situated in the Krasnodar Region on the same latitude as Nice, Toronto and Vladivostok. It sprawls 145 km along the shores of the Black Sea against the background of the snow-caped peaks of the Caucasus Mountains. Sochi has a population of 421,400 people and attracts over 4 million tourists annually.
